

Englewood City Council

October 12, 2010

The Englewood City Council met this date at the Englewood Government Center with Mayor Patricia Burnside presiding.

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Joe Zumwald, Jim Campise, Judy Gerhard, Tom Franz, Mike Kline and Marlyn Flee.

CITY STAFF & OFFICIALS PRESENT: Eric A. Smith, City Manager and Karen Soddors, Clerk of Council.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The Minutes from the Regular Session meeting held September 28, 2010 were approved as presented.

VISITORS LIST: The visitors list contained six (6) names and is on file in the Clerk's office.

VISITORS & COMMUNICATIONS:

1. Mayor Burnside presented a proclamation for "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" to Patty Rudd, a local breast cancer survivor.
2. Mayor Burnside presented a proclamation for "National Domestic Violence Awareness Month" to Kathy Lind, representing the Artemis Center for Domestic Violence. Mrs. Lind gave a presentation about the Artemis Center. Also present was David Caldwell, the Englewood Prosecutor, Police Chief Mark Brownfield, and Detective Alan Meade. This same group will be speaking at the Earl Heck Community Center on Wednesday, October 27th, regarding domestic violence.
3. There was no one else to speak.

ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS:

1. Bill No. 10-11 – APPROVING THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION OF NEW MATTER IN THE UPDATED AND REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCES; AND REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH (1ST reading)

Mr. Franz moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings and pass Bill No. 10-11 on the first reading. Mrs. Gerhard seconded the motion. **VOTE:** Mr. Kline, yea; Mr. Flee, yea; Mr. Zumwald, yea; Mr. Campise, yea; Mrs. Gerhard, yea; Mrs. Burnside, yea; Mr. Franz, yea. Motion approved. Ordinance No. 10-11 adopted this date.

2. Resolution – SUPPORTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A WRIGHT FLYER ICON TO BE LOCATED AT THE SOUTHWEST QUADRANT OF I-70 AND I-75

Mr. Franz moved to table this resolution and Mr. Kline seconded the motion. Discussion among the Council members followed. Several Council members did not want to commit to this project because they wanted more information regarding financing the project, maintenance and other issues. It was stated that in these economic times most people would not be in favor of spending millions of dollars for a project like this. **VOTE:** Mr. Kline, yea; Flee, yea; Mr. Zumwald, yea; Mr. Campise, yea; Mrs. Gerhard, yea; Mrs. Burnside, yea; Mr. Franz, yea. Motion approved to table the resolution.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

1. Crews are out picking up leaves two weeks earlier this year due to dry weather. Leaf pick-up will run until Wednesday, November 24th.
2. DP&L has reported that there will be a 3-5% increase for electrical service starting January 2011.
3. The Drainage Channel Project wrapped up today (October 12th). The City has applied for an OPWC grant to continue work on this project next year.
4. Half of the Englewood Drive bridge has been demolished. Work on the East Wenger Road water main project is proceeding smoothly.
5. Work on the South Main Street/Wenger Road Intersection Project is about 60% completed. Repainting the overhead sanitary sewer behind Angler's Carry-out is approximately 75% complete.
6. Mr. Smith reported that he and Law Director, Cindy McNamee, spent the day in Columbus at the Ohio Supreme Court. On Wednesday he will be attending the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals regarding the Sigler Case.
7. The City is buying three properties on the east side of South Main Street and should close on all three by the end of this week.

MAYOR'S REPORT

1. The Youth Orchestra from Billerbeck, Germany will be giving a concert tomorrow night (October 14th) at the Northmont High School Auditorium.
2. Mayor Burnside announced that she and Judy Gerhard spoke to a group of the Library's Home School Students today and took them on a tour of the Fire Department. She and Mrs. Gerhard will be talking to a group of Boy Scouts on Monday, October 25th.
